FFA ADVANCED COACHING COURSES TERMS

The completed, signed and dated registration form (Form) and these terms (including any incorporated terms) form a legally binding contract (Agreement) between the person named on the form (you) and Football Federation Australia Limited ABN 28 106 478 068 (FFA). This Agreement sets out the terms on which you apply for, and participate in, the coaching course as nominated on the Form (Course).

1 If you want to participate in the Course, you must:

- complete all areas on and sign and date the Form (Application);
- pay FFA the Fees either by cheque or money order made payable to "Football Federation Australia Limited" or by completing the credit card section on the Form; and
- send the Application together with your payment of the Fee to FFA to be received by no later than 14 days before the Course starts.

2 FFA will not process any Application that does not comply with clause 1 (including if a credit card cannot be charged for the designated amount) or which is incorrect, incomplete, unclear or damaged.

3 If you are successful, FFA will notify you in writing using the nominated details from your Form.

4 Cancellations will be accepted by FFA only in exceptional circumstances and on payment of a cancellation fee as specified by FFA depending on proximity of the Course start date.

5 You must comply with FFA Statutes, including the National Registration Regulations, Code of Conduct, Disciplinary Regulations and Grievance Resolution Regulations, (copies of which are available on www.footbballaustralia.com.au or on request).

6 You agree to submit exclusively to the jurisdiction of the Grievance Resolution Regulations and to not attempt to resolve any dispute or grievance the subject matter of the FFA Statutes in a court of law;

7 FFA may de-register you at any time by written notice, including if these Terms or its incorporated documents are not complied with.

8 Nothing in this clause 8 affects your rights under the Trade Practices Act 1974 (Cth) or similar legislation under which FFA's liability may not be excluded, restricted or modified by private agreement (TPA Rights).

If FFA is liable to you for any:

(a) breach by FFA of any express term of this Agreement or any term implied under the general law; or

(b) any tort committed by FFA (including negligence but not including fraud),

FFA's liability to you is limited (at FFA's election) to FFA repaying any amounts paid by you under this Agreement or supplying or resupplying any Course services to which you are entitled in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

Intermediate Coaching General Principles INFORMATION

What are the Intermediate Coaching General Principles?

The Intermediate Coaching General Principles are a series of educational modules for coaches who want to improve their skills and knowledge. From 2008, the Intermediate Coaching General Principles program replaces the former Level 2 Coaching General Principles.

Who is the program aimed at?

The program is aimed at coaches who have moved beyond the beginner level, and are looking to improve the performance of the athletes they coach. They are typically coaching at club or regional level.

What is covered in the Intermediate Coaching General Principles?

The Intermediate Coaching General Principles includes a simple introduction to sports science concepts and further information on coaching pedagogy. The 13 modules in the program are:

How do these modules integrate with my sport's coaching accreditation system?

The Intermediate Coaching General Principles are included by many sports within their sport-specific accreditation programs. Check with your sport regarding which modules they require coaches to complete as part of a sport-specific accreditation.

Many sports will also provide updating points towards re-accreditation to coaches completing modules from the Intermediate Coaching General Principles.

How can I enrol in an Intermediate Coaching General Principles course?

The program is available through state and territory departments of sport and recreation. Some offer face-to-face programs, while others offer the modules via correspondence. Some state and national sporting organisations also deliver the modules as part of their sport-specific accreditation programs.
