

FOOTBALL AUSTRALIA: TERMS OF ACCREDITATION (NATIONAL TEAMS)

The completed, signed and dated accreditation application form (**Form**) and these terms (including any incorporated terms), form a legally binding contract (**Agreement**) between the person named on the Form (**you**) and Football Australia Limited ACN 106 478 068 (**Football Australia**). By applying for accreditation, you agree to the terms of this Agreement.

1 ACCREDITATION APPLICATION FORM

- 1.1 You warrant that the information provided by you on the Form is current, true, and correct.
- 1.2 Football Australia will not process any Form that:
 - (a) is not clear, or completed in full; or
 - (b) has not been received by Football Australia before the Deadline.
- 1.3 Football Australia reserves the right to not accept any Form in its absolute discretion. Football Australia's decision is final and unsuccessful applicants cannot resubmit an application for accreditation.
- 1.4 If Football Australia accepts your application, Football Australia will notify you in writing and forward you an accreditation pass with applicable access zones (**Accreditation**).

2 TERMS OF USE

- 2.1 You must comply with all terms of this Agreement.
- 2.2 You must comply with:
 - (a) Football Australia's applicable rules and regulations (including the Quarantine Management Plan, National Code of Conduct and Spectator Code of Behaviour, available at <https://www.footballaustralia.com.au/governance/statutes-and-regulations> or on request), to the extent that such do not directly conflict with the rights granted in your Accreditation; and
 - (b) the Venue operator's rules and regulations (including the Terms of Admission and COVID-19 General Access Rules as prescribed by Football Australia and/or the Venue operator from time to time), which may include:
 - (i) pre-entry screening requirements such as temperature checks, evidence of COVID-19 double vaccination (hard copy or digital) and QR code check-in;
 - (ii) face masks and physical distancing requirements;
 - (iii) other health checks and requirements as determined by NSW Health Orders; and
 - (iv) general inspections, bag checks, and the removal of any prohibited and restricted items.

- 2.3 You acknowledge that the Accreditation:
- (a) is issued to you personally and cannot be loaned, transferred, assigned or licensed to any other person; and
 - (b) must be worn and prominently displayed at all times while in the Venue, other than when your role at the Match prevents you from doing so (such as television presenters on camera).
- 2.4 Depending on your role, a further condition (such as wearing a designated bib) may be imposed on access to certain zones within the Venue.
- 2.5 It is an essential condition of this Agreement and of the right of admission to the Match conferred on the holder of a ticket that you agree with Football Australia:
- (a) not to resell or transfer, or attempt to resell or transfer, the ticket at a premium;
 - (b) not to use it for advertising, promotion or other commercial purposes (including competitions and trade promotions) or to enhance the demand for other goods or services; and
 - (c) not to bundle it with other goods or services, without Football Australia's prior consent. If this condition is breached, Football Australia may, in addition to any other remedy and even if the holder of the ticket did not have notice of the condition or the breach, deny the holder admission to the Match and retain the price of the ticket.
- 2.6 You will gain entrance to the Venue (and a zone within the Venue) only with your ticket and on presentation of valid Accreditation and, if requested, proof of identity.
- 2.7 You must not:
- (a) carry or wear any political, promotional, advertising or other commercial material of whatever nature (save for material provided by Football Australia), which is visible at the Match; or
 - (b) do anything which brings Football Australia, the Match or football into disrepute.
- 2.8 You must comply with the directions of Football Australia staff whilst in and around the Venue on match day.
- 2.9 You must not use any information obtained as a result of your Accreditation for the purpose of anyone betting on, or in relation to, any Match or in any other way which may amount to a breach of FFA's the National Code of Conduct.
- 2.10 The Competition Administrator may at any time issue further directions, conditions and policies relating to Accreditation and access to the Venue, which you must comply with.

3 HEALTH & SAFETY GUIDELINES

- 3.1 You agree that an inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any place where people gather. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. You assume all risks, hazards, and dangers arising from or relating in any way to the risk of contracting COVID-19 or any other communicable disease or illness, or a bacteria, virus or other pathogen capable of causing a communicable disease or illness, whether occurring before, during, or after the event, however caused or contracted, and voluntarily waive all claims and potential claims against Football Australia and the Venue operator relating to such risks.
- 3.2 You should source your own Personal Protection Equipment, but Football Australia will have face masks available upon request.
- 3.3 You must practice physical distancing at all times while inside the venue.
- 3.4 You are required to wash and/or disinfect your hands frequently.
- 3.5 You must not under any circumstances enter the field of play, locker rooms, or come into contact with players or personnel in the Red Zone. This includes players, coaches, match officials, and select team/event staff. You acknowledge that contact with Red Zone personnel may result in a requirement of 14 days quarantine, with such costs borne by you.
- 3.6 You must comply with all with all government restrictions, directives of health authorities and directions, conditions and policies of Football Australia and the Venue relating to health and safety.

4 RESTRICTIONS OF FILMING AND PHOTOGRAPHS

- 4.1 From two hours before the start of the Match until one (1) hour after the end of the Match, only the Host Broadcaster and other Football Australia approved rights holding broadcasters are allowed to film or record any vision inside the Venue (including in the dressing rooms and on the field of play). For the avoidance of doubt, this means non-rights holders cannot record “stand-ups” with the crowd, Venue or Match in the background.
- 4.2 Paragraph 4.1 does not apply to the post-Match media conference that is held in the official post-Match media conference room. The post-Match media conference is open to all news crews and non-broadcasting television and radio stations.
- 4.3 Only the Official Photographer appointed by Football Australia (Getty Images) is permitted to sell or licence any rights in photographs or images captured within the Venue to any third party for commercial use.
- 4.4 In the case of all other photographers, Accreditation is granted for the sole purpose of enabling you to capture and provide photographs to your publication or bona fide news organisations that subscribe to your service for editorial, private or non-advertising purposes, and not for any commercial purpose whatsoever. For the avoidance of doubt, commercial purposes include sale on the internet, licensing (except to bona fide news organisations for editorial purposes), memorabilia, or marketing.

- 4.5 You must remain behind the sponsor boards behind the goal lines at each end of the field of play. You must at all times whilst within the Venue wear a Football Australia photographer's bib that must be prominently displayed and worn over your clothing. The photographer's bib must be returned at the end of the Match.

5 REPLACEMENT, SUSPENSION OR CANCELLATION

- 5.1 The Accreditation is and remains the property of Football Australia and Football Australia may suspend or cancel Accreditation at any time, including where you do not comply with this Agreement.
- 5.2 The suspension or cancellation of Accreditation by Football Australia and your eviction from the Venue is without prejudice to any other rights or remedies that Football Australia or any other regulatory body may have against you or your Organisation. Suspension or cancellation may also impact on rights to accreditation for you and your Organisation for future Football Australia matches.
- 5.3 Lost or stolen Accreditation must be immediately reported to Football Australia in writing. Football Australia may, in its absolute discretion, issue duplicate Accreditation and charge a replacement fee.

6 LIABILITY

- 6.1 You agree:
- (a) that your movement in and around the Venue is at your own risk;
 - (b) not to bring any claim or proceeding against Football Australia for any damage, loss, injury, or liability you may suffer in accessing the Venue or carrying out your duties; and
 - (c) to safeguard your equipment or property (including personal property such as bags and money) and acknowledge that Football Australia is not responsible for any lost, stolen or damaged property.
- 6.2 Football Australia:
- (a) is not liable to you for any loss or damage you suffer as a result of the Match being cancelled, postponed or changed;
 - (b) is not liable to you for any loss or damage you suffer as a result of Football Australia exercising its rights in accordance with this Agreement (including pursuant to section 5);
 - (c) disclaims the existence of any common law duty of care to you and any holder of the ticket; and
 - (d) except for liability that by law cannot be excluded, Football Australia excludes all liability to you in tort (including negligence), contract or bailment for acts or omissions

of Football Australia, its employees and contractors arising out of or in relation to your access to the Venue.

7 PRIVACY

- 7.1 The personal information that Football Australia collects on the Form is used for the purpose of processing your request for accreditation. You may request access to personal information Football Australia holds about you by sending an email to privacy@footballaustralia.com.au. For full details of Football Australia's Privacy Policy, go to www.footballaustralia.com.au.
- 7.2 You acknowledge that you may be filmed or recorded while in the Venue and that you will not make any claim against Football Australia for the use of your name, voice, image and/or likeness in association with such film or recording.

8 GENERAL

- 8.1 Football Australia may choose not to enforce a term of this Agreement in some cases in its absolute discretion without affecting its right to enforce that term in other cases.
- 8.2 Football Australia reserves the right to amend or update this Agreement at any time without prior notice by issuing new terms and conditions. It is your obligation to ensure that you have read, understood and agree to the most recent terms and conditions before continuing to use your Accreditation.
- 8.3 The dates, times, participating teams and the Venue of the Match may change without notice to you.
- 8.4 This Agreement:
- (a) is governed by the law applicable in the state of New South Wales and each party submits to the jurisdiction of the courts of that state; and
 - (b) is the entire agreement between Football Australia and you in respect of its subject matter.
- 8.5 Any terms used but not defined in these terms, have the meaning given to them on the Form.
