## INTRODUCTION

## To the Australian Football Community,

What a year 2023 was for football in Australia. A year that captured the hearts and united all football participants at all levels and the entire Australian public.

It is my pleasure to provide the Australian football community with our 2023 National Participation Report in a year that showcased the most successful women's sporting event in Australian and FIFA Women's World Cup ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ history.

Australia's passion for football has never been clearer. With record attendances, broadcast numbers, and the extraordinary atmosphere throughout the tournament showcasing how deeply our nation loves this game.

The CommBank Matildas did the nation proud. Their journey through the tournament captivated all of Australia, with matches rating an average of 3.44 million viewers per match domestically. The aggregate viewership for their seven fixtures stands at a staggering 24.08 million. The highlight being 7.13 million people tuning in to watch the CommBank Matildas Semi-Final against England on the Seven Network.

We would like to congratulate the CommBank Matildas' playing squad, head coach Tony Gustavsson and his technical and support staff, for producing our best result at any FIFA Women's World Cup ${ }^{\text {TM }}$. Fourth in the world is a phenomenal achievement and we are extremely proud of the team.

Inspired by the outstanding success of the FIFA Women's World Cup ${ }^{\text {TM }}$, and the nation-uniting performances of the CommBank Matildas, Football Australia would like to thank and acknowledge the Federal Government's groundbreaking announcement of the Play Our Way Program to fund the improvement of sporting facilities and equipment specifically for women and girls in response to the extraordinary rise in female participation in community sport.

With an investment of $\$ 200$ million, the Play Our Way grants program will promote equal access, build more suitable facilities, and support grassroots initiatives to get women and girls to engage, stay, and participate in sport throughout their lives.

Following their FIFA Men's World Cup Qatar 2022 ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ success, the Subway Socceroos kickstarted 2023 with their homecoming series in March against Ecuador. A rematch in June followed against FIFA Men's World Cup Qatar 2022 ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ winners, Argentina, played in China, narrowly losing 2-0 to the number 1 ranked team in the world. The October international window provided the Subway Socceroos with an exciting opportunity to face England at Wembley Stadium in front of 81,116 spectators. And in November, the Subway Socceroos commenced the qualification phase for the FIFA Men's World Cup $2026{ }^{\text {TM }}$ to be hosted by USA, Canada and Mexico.

Over the past few years, Football Australia has led a strategy to drive the growth of the sport by leveraging our participation in global football tournaments and the hosting of the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ to grow the brands of our two iconic senior national teams, the Subway Socceroos and CommBank Matildas, and to bring these teams closer than ever before to our the Australian football community, the largest club participation sport in the country. 2023 was a year that saw the culmination of this strategy and as a result, we have seen activity in school football programs, outdoor registered, social football and community programs drive a $12 \%$ total growth nationally in participation to 1,715,441 participants.

Pleasingly, this growth was driven by one of football's most committed participant groups, Outdoor Registered Players, which represents those who sign up for our traditional community winter season across a 22 -week period. This group now significantly exceeds our pre COVID-19 shutdown numbers with 42,710 new participants playing community
football in season 2023. This represents an $8 \%$ growth compared to the previous year following on the back of the Subway Socceroos performance at the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022 ${ }^{\text {TM }}$. In general, men and boys' participation continued to demonstrate strong growth in numbers, with $13 \%$ annual increase across outdoor, futsal and social.

It should also be noted that due to the timing of the FIFA Women's World Cup $2023^{\text {™ }}$, our registered football seasons were coming to their completion and as such any FIFA Women's World Cup $2023^{\text {TM }}$ participation uplift will likely be reflected in Football Australia's season 2024 registered participation numbers.

Following an amazing year of football, we shift towards 2024 in a solid position with positive increases in participation across all major formats of our game.

We have seen strong participation growth in social football, outdoor registered football, registered coaches, registered referees, and community football programs. The support and dedication from all the community club administrators, volunteers, coaches, referees, players, and fans across 2023 has been outstanding. Everyone has contributed to a year of football that in many ways will go down in history.

I would like to acknowledge our commercial partners and sponsors that continue to support our game from grassroots football to all our National Teams and to personally thank everyone for their support and dedication our game.

## Outdoor Registered Football

- Total participation increased by 42,710 or $8 \%$


## School Programs

- Total schools programs increased by 27,529 or $6 \%$
- A $10 \%$ increase or 11,651 participants in Football Australia delivered Sporting Schools programs, including football being the leading provider of Sporting Schools programs for the second consecutive year in Term 2 for Australian students. The total students engaged through Football Australia's Sporting Schools program was 130,758.


## Social \& Futsal

Futsal has seen significant growth in 2023 with 64,898 participants, this is an increase of $11 \%$ compared to 2022 participation.

Social/Summer continues to achieve positive numbers with 154,403 participants with an increase of 36\% compared with 2022. The successful Socceroos performance at the FIFA World Cup Qatar $2022^{\text {TM }}$ and the excitement building towards the FIFA Women's World Cup 2023 ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ in Australia and New Zealand pushed to an increase of 40,465 participants.

## Coaches

National Coach workforce of over 200 Participation Officers established to deliver Sporting Schools, MiniRoos \& Junior Participation programs.

Coach registrations increased by 4,743 in 2023, with a total number of registered coaches now at 57,488 with an increase of $9 \%$ year on year.

## Schools and Community Programs

Schools participation has grown by 27,529 or $6 \%$, this is on the back of a $42 \%$ increase in 2022. Football Australia sporting schools continuing to deliver significant participation growth with 130,758, 10\% increase on last year. Other Schools Programs total: 373,666.
Total School participants 504,424
Community events and promotional experiences once again displays growth, $27 \%$ growth on the previous year with 292,757 participants. This follows on from a strong $21 \%$ increase in 2022.

## Women and Girls

Women and Girls represented 190,746 participants in outdoor, futsal, social and registered football, this shows the $9 \%$ increase compared to 2022 participation. Moving into 2024, we look to again see a strong increase women and girls participation on the back of the FIFA Women's World Cup 2023™.

## Men and boys

Following on from both the FIFA Women's World Cup $2023^{\text {TM }}$ and FIFA Men's World Cup $2022^{\text {TM }}$ the men and boys participation continues to demonstrate growth in numbers with $13 \%$ annual increase across outdoor, futsal and social.
